THE A23 TRUNK ROAD (HOOLEY)
(50 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 1998

Made 30th November 1998 Coming into force 18th December 1998

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the A23 Trunk Road (Hooley) (50 Miles Per Hour Speed Limit) Order 1998 and shall come into force on 18th December 1998.
- 2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the lengths of the A23 Trunk Road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

THE SCHEDULE

Lengths of trunk road subject to a speed limit of 50 miles per hour The following lengths of the A23 Trunk Road at Hooley in the County of Surrey -

- (a) the northbound carriageway of the A23 Trunk Road, from its junction with the northbound carriageway of the M23 Motorway to a point 35 metres south of its junction with Dean Lane, a total distance of approximately 880 metres; and
- (b) the southbound carriageway of the A23 Trunk Road, from a point 35 metres south of its junction with Dean Lane to its junction with the southbound carriageway of the M23 Motorway, a total distance of approximately 450 metres.

All distances are measured along those lengths of road.
